Not returning your working out sheets may result in less marks and possibly not passing, as only your answer to a question can be marked.

Section 3 contains TEN questions on the calculation of Transits, Progressions and Directions in the horoscope. All questions must be answered. (30 Marks)

Section 4 consists of TWENTY-FIVE multiple choice questions. You must answer TWENTY of them. (20 Marks
